## NONDISCRIMINATION IN DISTRICT PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

The Board of Trustees is committed to equal opportunity for all individuals in education. District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination based on gender, race, color, religion, national origin, ethnic group, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability or any other unlawful consideration. The Board shall promote programs which ensure that discriminatory practices are eliminated in all District activities.

District programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be readily accessible to individuals with disabilities. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that interested persons, including those with impaired vision and hearing, can obtain information about available programs, facilities and activities.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, employee organizations and sources of referral and applicants for admission and employment about the District's policy on nondiscrimination. Such notification shall be included in each announcement, bulletin or application form distributed to these groups. (34 CFR <u>104.8</u>, 106.9)

The Superintendent or designee shall also provide information about related complaint procedures.
